#### Council Minutes Nov 15, 2023

Spent the first  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  hour listening to Steve Peterson explain how he would set up our website and what is included on the site. It would cost \$1950 and it includes 60 day assistance after it goes live. It would cost \$336 for the following year. He charges \$75/ hour for assistance but in 15 minute increments. He will work with Kris to obtain the information to put in the various categories. They don't all have to be filled in immediately before we go live.

#### **Old Business**

#### **New Business**

There had been a request to use the church for a wedding in Dec 2024. The couple nor their families are members of Grace, and they wanted another minister to officiate. The Council decided not to agree to allow the wedding. There is an old Wedding & Policy Handbook. This will need to be updated. The executive committee will meet Mon. Dec. 11 at 5:00 to discuss the budget for 2024.

A five-ten year vision committee needs to be created. This will be discussed later.

There will be a Christmas lighted display in the Elroy park. The registration is \$40. 15 groups have signed up so far. It will go live 11/28. It was felt that it was too late for Grace to participate this year but maybe next year.

The timer on the electronic sign has been set to go on at 6:00am and off at 9:00pm. Somebody had been unplugging the sign. Dave will get it hardwired in the future.

Tom Stowell will be getting the Christmas trees for the sanctuary & front entrance. They will be decorated after 12/3 worship service. People are asked to bring an ornament in memory of someone and to place it on the small tree. Dave Clark will assist Dave Houzner in putting up the wreaths in the entry windows. Sun 12/24 morning worship will begin at **9:00** instead of 10:10. Christmas Eve worship will be at 5:00.
