NOTES FROM KRIS

There is one thing that I do that very much overlaps the work I do for Grace with what I do for my own enjoyment. That activity is reading.

Just this morning I looked at a book I recently acquired for the cost of shipping only. It was a "free" book I'd earned from ordering other books from Thriftbooks. The other books were mostly those I'd ordered to aid in preparing the messages for the Wandering Heart series about Peter that we have been enjoying this Lent and will continue to look at into the Easter season. It is a collection of stories and sermons for the Advent and Christmas season-a chapter for each day from November 23 to January 7. I sampled one chapter and am now looking forward to that season so I can read the whole book.

Reading is a great way to strengthen your faith and expand your mind about matters of theology. For me it is a great way to prepare for and think of ideas for sermons. But not all benefits of reading are related to faith.

Reading is a great escape from "screen time" which many of us get more than enough of. Reading can reduce stress, improve focus, sleep, and brain health. Reading can lead to expanded vocabulary and increased knowledge. It can boost creativity, memory, communication skills and imagination. Reading can increase empathy and mental health. Reading can expose us to other peoples, cultures, and ways of life, which can help us see our lives with new insight. Reading can be relaxing and entertaining. Readers tend to live longer.

If you re interested in some of the books I have read--there is lots of fiction among the religious stuff--you may come to my office and borrow a book. I know at least one of you has one of my books now.

Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton | Easter 2024

"So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone for they were afraid." That's where the Gospel of Mark originally ended. And it just seems so odd to me. It's so abrupt. I mean, the women had seen the angel. He'd announced that Jesus was raised from the dead, and then he tells them all this good news and wants them to go on their way. And they just are not going to say a single word.

There are three words in that passage that really stand out for me, especially in the Greek. One is fear — *phobos*. We get phobia from that. The other one is amazement — *ekstasis*. We get ecstasy from that. And the other one has to do with being seized. It actually means "being possessed." So we take a look at these women, and they've had this miraculous appearance by an angel. They've heard the good news that Jesus has raised from the dead, and they're too afraid to do anything about it, and they just are going to be silent. It seems that nothing changed. They came to take care of Jesus' dead body because on the Sabbath they could not work. But on the first day of the week, they were there. They have this announcement, and then it's all the same.

Sometimes I think we feel like nothing's changed. Sometimes I think that the events in our country, in our church, around the world are just so terrifying and so overwhelming that it seems like the resurrection really didn't make a difference. But these three words really say something about the women, and I think about us and, most especially, about Easter. When they said that they were filled with amazement — this is this ecstasy, *ekstasis* — they were really standing. It means literally standing in a different place. So though they were still in the tomb and they hadn't reacted yet, nevertheless, everything had changed. And because of the resurrection, we, all of us, are standing in a different place. The whole of creation is standing in a different place. And the word for fear, *phobos*, phobia we get from that. But it's really a sense of trembling in the presence of God, of awe that they were actually filled with awe — not paralyzed by fear but filled with awe. And I hope this Easter-tide and all year round, we have a sense of the presence of God that fills us with awe. And it also says that they were seized with fear. Well, the word means "possessed." And yes, we believe that in baptism because of the resurrection, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit and we now are all Spirit-possessed.

When things seem to be staying the same, when things seem to be happening and coming at us so quickly, I think it's very important to take time to be a little amazed, to be standing in a different place, to have a sense of this awe and trembling before the Lord, and to allow ourselves to be possessed by the Spirit, who will give us power and courage in these times. My favorite hymn is "Lord Jesus, You Shall Be My Song." It's *ELW* 808. And the last verse goes like this: "I fear in the dark and the doubt of my journey; but courage will come with the sound of his steps by my side. And with all of the family Jesus saved by his love, we'll sing to his dawn at the end of our journey."

Meeting called to order at 5:10pm

Meeting minutes from January read and MM by Dave to approve the minutes. Kris 2nd all approved minutes passed.

No treasurer's report available for January. Post pone review until March meeting where we will review both January and February treasurer reports.

Grace Senior Meals: Kris commented that outreach from other congregations may be willing to help (meal prep and clean up and monies donated) with the mission of senior meals. This is not official, and the council will take this into consideration. Barb Nofsinger estate has a freezer to be donated to Grace Lutheran. This freezer can be utilized for extra food storage be it the food pantry or the senior meals needs. Arrangements will be made to move this freezer to Grace.

Technology: Jack Besant and Dave Clark met with Tristate out of La Crosse about a sound system. This company encouraged us to keep the current speakers and no hang down speaker. We are waiting on their bid. Discussion on audio/visual options.

Maintenance: Churches rain gutters repaired that were damaged during heavy snows last month. BTU grievance on paying the bill for a freezer repair. Several calls and delays because of parts to be ordered and repair time. Dave Clark will review the bill and discuss it with BTU.

Garage Sale: discussion on how to minimize garbage dropped off at the garage sale site. To be discussed with Karen Nelson the option of posted hours for drop off so stuff can be inspected. List needed as to what will be accepted and not accepted should be posted.

Youth Luther League/CHIPS: sub sandwich sale income discussed and agreed to pay bills for supplies out of Youth Faith formation account. Pie sale March 29th in the works.

Property: storage room cleaned out. Unused equipment decision as to sell or keep. Insulated boxes, Tray trolley, pie safe. It was said some of that equipment was originally from the Mauston Hospital and used during the smorgasbord times. The dishwasher again has issues with the electrical valves on the water heater. Dave is working with Larry Woodlif on repairs.

Garbage receptacles discussed. Food Pantry is paying half of the bill for recycling because of large amounts of cardboard disposal.
