# **Lenten Services begin this month!**

# Ash Wednesday is February 14th.

Join us for worship at 6:30 pm for a service focused on God's unfailing love that will include the imposition of ashes.

Mid-week Lenten services will begin on Wednesday, February 21. A light soup supper at 5:30 pm will be followed by worship at 6:30 pm. There is a sign-up sheet in the narthex for volunteers to provide and serve the meal.

Mid-week services this year follow the theme "Wandering Heart", from Sanctified Art. Wandering Heart focuses on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most familiar disciples, Peter.

We will see in Peter a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. The prayers, confession and affirmation of faith will be more contemporary than those we use in our Sunday worship. Instead of a round robin of preachers, each preacher will lead services in their own congregation. A video message from preachers throughout the conference will be featured.

Come and join us and discover how we are like Peter and how we can use his story to strengthen our own relationship with Jesus!

#### NOTES FROM KRIS

It has been brought to my attention that you may not know much about what makes up my day working for the Grace Lutheran congregation. I suppose this could be the case if you only see me leading worship and preaching on Sunday morning.

Part of being a Synod Authorized Minister (SAM) in the La Crosse Area Synod of the ELCA involves learning. One weekend each month during the school year, I attend the Lay School of the Northeast Synod of Wisconsin. The classes are on Friday night from 7-10 pm and Saturday morning from 9 am until noon. These classes are taught by experts in their own area of interest. The topics are wide ranging and can vary from an in-depth look at a single Gospel to Bible storytelling in areas of the world that have no written language.

In the fall and spring, this learning involves traveling to Chippewa Falls and spending the night. The in-person classes are important because it allows us to develop relationships with others who are also either a SAM or an adult with interest in topics related to the church. The in-person weekends also allow for us to worship together prior to class on Saturday morning. In the winter we learn by Zoom.

During the week when I am in the office, in addition to writing a sermon each week, I participate in a weekly Zoom text study with other pastors/ SAM's in our conference of our Synod. Once per month this group meets in person at one of the congregations for text study, updates from the Synod, and worship, and often a meal together. These gatherings allow us to collaborate, support, and pray for one another and our ministry settings.

Other office time involves planning and developing worship bulletins and the newsletter. Assisting with the bookkeeping, answering the phone and sending on messages, retrieving mail and sorting, and a number of other administrative activities are involved as we have limited secretarial help. Each month I attend and participate in the Council meeting and share a devotional message.

I am also always available to visit with and bring Communion to those who are sick or homebound who do not have someone else bringing

Communion to them on a regular basis.

Also leading and preparing messages for funerals is a privilege that I have within our Grace congregation and community. And, of course, baptizing all of those we welcome into our community is a joy.

I continue to be part of the Synod Evangelism and Outreach Team, and I am honored to work with Grace's many committees. Leading Bible Studies for the youth attending the National Youth Gathering and teaching Confirmation are particularly meaningful aspects of my work.

**And there is time for you.** So if you ever want an ear to bend or have any questions about what I am learning or doing, just give me a call or stop by the office.

#### **Committee Reports**
